Tea boy

(A true war-time story)



During my period of service with the R.A.F, I was stationed in Gibraltar, and one incident stands out in my memory.

One pleasant, sunny morning, I and my fellow "instrument bashers" were relaxing outside our workshop. This workshop consisted of a converted packing case (originally used for shipping spitfires) fitted with shelves piled high with silica-gel, which is a substance then used in the air dryers of the auto-pilot.

At this time, there were standing instructions that all personnel wishing to cross the runway must do so at the end or where the road from the Rock into Spain cut across it. As the NAAFI building was at the other side of the runway and today was my turn to collect the tea, I reluctantly departed for the canteen armed with our tea container – a ten-pound jam tin with twisted strands of copper locking wire for the handle.

As I was waiting to be served with the usual "char and wads", there was a lull chatter and we heard that there was a "kite on fire on the runway". Not being the first kite fire, we had seen on The Rock, this information did not cause any great stir and a few people moved from their place in the queue. However, an announcement come over the Tannoy which made the whole thing a little less routine. "The Hudson aircraft on fire half-way down the runway is fully armed with depth-charges and ammunition for the guns. The fire has a firm hold and the fire-fighters have withdrawn. All personnel will keep as far away as possible from the burning aircraft". Questions were being asked all around me as to the effect of depth charges exploding in the air and not beneath the waves. By this time, I had 8 cups of tea poured into my jam tin and should have started my return journey. The idea of waiting in the canteen until it was all over was dismissed by the thought of the reception I would receive at my section when I arrived late with a couple of pints of cold tea. The instructions were to keep as far away from the fire as possible and in walking back I needed be no nearer than I was at present — so I made my decision and started back.

Now walking with an open-top, three quarters full of tea, is not the simple exercise it might appear to be. A full stride is out of the question — the liquid will slop out and half will be lost. A slow stroll means a full can of cold tea. I compromised with a stiff-armed glide, with many back ward glances at the fiercely burning Hudson.

As I was crossing the end of the runway at the farthest point from the fire, I became aware of a noise I had previously heard and it dawned on me that it was the ammunition exploding and the bullets ricocheting off the runway. I broke into a fast trot to find some cover and law was with me. I arrived back considerably out of breath and shaken but as I only had about half the quantity of tea I received no sympathy, only sarcastic remarks. As I was about to reply, another announcement came over the Tannoy — "all personnel to take cover immediately. It is expected that the depth charges aboard the Hudson will explode with in the next few minutes".

Although the only cover was our rather flimsy converted packing case — which was not secured in the ground in anyway — a concerted dive was made for its doubtful safety and the bench inside. When the explosion came, we rocked back and forth and everything was mixed up like a fruit bowl. Not least of the ingredients were the tins of silica-gel, many of which had lost their lids allowing the contents to cascade all over us.

A few seconds – which seemed considerably longer – noise and motion ceased, and we began to disentangle ourselves. It was then that I saw what had happened to the tin of tea I had run the gauntlet of exploding ammunition to bring back. It was filled and nearly obscured by the mound of silica-gel.

I was never again entrusted with the important task of fetching the morning tea.

Hello Wollaston!

We are delighted to be included in Wollaston Together and look forward to regularly communicating with you



all. As you may be aware, since moving to Wollaston in 1940 Scott Bader has grown into a global business. We now have 18 offices and 7 manufacturing sites around the world. Our Wollaston site is our Headquarters and somewhere we are very proud to be.

#### Here's an update from our UK Site Director, Sean Beaumont:

"Hi everyone,

My name is Sean and I am the Site Director here at the Wollaston site. I have been with the company for around a 18 months and it has been a busy but productive time.

Celebrating the 100-year anniversary with the company and our colleagues is a landmark moment in anyone's career and it is my aim to secure the future of the site for the next 100 years to make sure that we are a good neighbour to the local community, which we are proud to be a part of.

The Wollaston site is the largest site in the group, and we are currently going through an important site transformation which will bring in significant extra capital spend, a large portion of which will be spent to reduce our impact in the village. We will be replacing a critical piece of our equipment with a new carbon bed system which is both more sustainable in terms of Carbon generation, but which is also significantly more efficient and reliable, which will eliminate a large portion of odours from the site.

Thank you and I look forward to speaking with you again soon."

In case you are still not sure what Scott Bader does, we manufacture high-performance resins, gelcoats, adhesives and functional polymers that are used to make products such as wind blades for wind turbines, luxury yachts, interior and exterior parts for trains, automotive parts with a particular focus on adhesives for electric battery trays and many more.

Did you know, Scott Bader was the first employee-owned company in the UK? We became employee-owned in 1951 when our founder, Ernest Bader and the Bader family, gifted their shares to the workforce through the formation of the Scott Bader Commonwealth, a charitable trust that holds the shares of the company.

The Scott Bader difference is underpinned by the fact we are a Commonwealth, which means we are owned by our colleagues, who as Trustees of Scott Bader Commonwealth, are responsible for the wellbeing of the business. That means

Applications for the Centenary fund can be submitted from 1st to 30th September 2022 via the Scott Bader website. Charities that apply must be registered in the UK.





It is a structured programme set out by the Royal Life Saving Society with achievement awards promoting lifesaving, water safety, personal survival and first aid skills through fun learning. Receive badges and certificates for your achievements. We run 2 groups, bronze and Silver & Gold.

The **weekly fee** is £3.00 per child, which is used to buy equipment and sponsor additional activities such as open water activities – Wind surfing, Kayaking, sailing, and raft races. We also have other activities throughout the year, scuba diving, bowling and visiting the local Christmas Panto.

The club is run by volunteers who have a combination of qualifications and ALL have Police clearance to work with children.

#### A day in the life of a Wollaston Sixth form student

At Wollaston Sixth Form, although the basic structure of the day remains the same, activities differ daily. One week, students are focusing on their subjects and preparing for life-changing exams, the next they can be seen dancing 'Strictly-style' with their favourite teacher. Pretty exciting right? Well, we are here to strip it all back and tell you the bare bones about what life is truly like at Wollaston Sixth Form.



When entering the gates of the Sixth Form, you are immediately greeted with familiar faces to start your day off Then it's off to your form room where you'll discover the news of the day and plan your time; since it is first thing in the morning, it prepares your brain for challenges that you have to overcome throughout the day. On Fridays, you'll be competing in exciting form activities. Whether that be racing around the school looking for hidden clues or completing quizzes, all that matters is achieving glory for the form and having some fun to finish the week.



Lessons that follow are dependent on your personalised timetable. For example, you could have a sociology lesson with Mr Hopkins, the atmosphere will be focused on progress and learning, but it is so different from lower school with more discussion and debate taking place. When you are not in class you'll typically journey back to the sixth form centre.



Dependent on the day you might have a supervised study. This allows you to have a structured revision session giving you the opportunity to revise without distractions. Similarly, with a teacher to work with you always have any support you need. If you're finished with your work, there is always more available with revision sheets that can be adapted to every subject. We know these study sessions are really helpful when we are feeling overwhelmed with work. There are many

places to go to work independently, such as the school library, you can study wherever suits you best. Although studying is very important, your mental health is equally as significant. So, as sixth form students, we recommend a break at times. You can read a book or chat to your friends, just do whatever you can to relax.

Once you hear the bell for break, the study centre transforms into a room of bustling, chaotic teenagers. This is where the sixth form is at its liveliest. You hang out with friends and have some fun before going back to class. You may venture to the canteen to grab a freshly baked cake or cookie to satisfy your hunger. At just £1, what a bargain!

Your days will really vary, one might be filled with study periods and another with all day lessons. One morning could be working with Year 7 students to help them develop their reading skills, the afternoon could see you on the field in a football tournament or completing the assault course. Overall, Sixth Form is an enjoyable experience. Although sometimes it's a little stressful, there are always people to help and we are really valuing the time this wonderful school has given us.

We continue to make cakes for local hospices and in May made cakes for Cynthia Spencer and in September, we will be providing cakes for Cransley Hospice

We have organised lunches, trips, and supported events held by other WIs in the County.

On 21<sup>st</sup> July, we had a talk and cream tea at the Hind Hotel and learnt about its history and their renovation plans.

On 25<sup>th</sup> August some members are going on a trip to Kensington Palace, organised by RB Travel and to Chatsworth House on 18th November.

Our Members continue to knit baby clothes and blankets to support Baby Basics, based in Wollaston and (following a talk in January from Right Resolution CIC about the Jeevan Project) our Members now regularly donate items to support young women leaving the care system who experience period poverty.

So all in all a busy, but fun year, which was a challenge after such a long time of not being able to meet due to the lockdowns.

A warm welcome awaits you at Wollaston WI and we are always looking for new members with fresh ideas why not give it a try and come along to our meeting on 14<sup>th</sup> September when we are having a talk by Kevin Vary called Sweet Treats.



Some houses are now being built and it possible to imagine what the finished development will look like. The site is called Summers Grange after Wollaston's Olympic Champion and it will contain 2, 3, and 4 bedroom homes.

The sales launch date is December 2022 and **01933 558281** is the number to call to register your interest with Bloor Homes. Social housing will be provided by Sage and Bloor Homes will manage sales of the shared ownership homes.

The first occupation is expected in February 2023, 50% occupation by the end of 2023 with the whole project finished in early 2026.

One unusual aspect of this development is that 40% of the area is devoted to green space, including 2 hectares of woodland for the whole village to enjoy, thus complying with the Neighbourhood Plan.

Work is also progressing with the outline design of the new Village Hall and the Parish Council is working towards presenting the plans to the Community by the autumn along with an idea of funding and construction costs.

#### September 2022 Wollaston Parish Council



At the time of writing (the beginning of August) we are in the middle of (or at the end of - who knows?) one of the driest spells of weather for many years.

Whilst hot sunny days are welcomed by players and spectators alike, it does make the maintenance of pitches and outfields a lot more time consuming than normal.



However, we are fortunate that at Wollaston we have a dedicated ground maintenance team who ensure that the playing conditions here are first class and match any ground in our area.

#### What is Two Factor Authentication?

Two factor authentication (2FA) provides a way of double-checking that the person logging on to your online account is really you.



#### Secure Logon Required

#### How does Two Factor Authentication work?

In addition to a strong long password, accounts secured with two factor authentication use a second factor to verify the user when logging on. This is something that only you have or have trusted access to, such as an app

on a personal device or a phone number which can be used to receive logon text messages or calls.



#### How do I use Two Factor Authentication?

To switch on two factor authentication on each of your accounts you will need to access them using a web

browser or dedicated app. This feature may also be called two-step verification (2SV) on some apps/accounts, but essentially works the same. Instructions on enabling two factor authentication (2FA or 2SV) for most popular email, commerce and social media websites can be found on the reverse of this flyer.

#### What if my online account doesn't support Two Factor Authentication?

We would ideally like to see two factor authentication offered on all online accounts and services which might hold your personal data, have access to your money, or play an important role in your life. Although most do offer it, some large providers like BT, Virgin Media and TalkTalk still don't. If it is not available on an important account like email, you should ensure it is secured with a long strong and separate password.
